On Sunday, June 4th members toured the work in progress at our new location, 509 East Deerpath Road.

Since its renovation began in May, the former Church of Christ Scientist sanctuary has been transformed into a spacious Education Hall (generously funded by the Hunter Family) with a state-of-the-art, multi-media projection system and the capacity to host future programs and lectures for up to 150 people. Progress is underway to make the museum accessible to all with a hearing loop in the Education Hall, and ADA accessible entrance and bathrooms.

Finishing touches are being completed on the climate-controlled collections storage room and a brand new temporary exhibit space. Members were also invited to tour the administrative offices and research center adjacent to the museum building.

Incoming President John Ormsby addressed the crowd providing an update on the status of the Capital Campaign to date. Members enjoyed ice cream and lemonade on what turned out to be an incredibly hot, but exciting summer day!

The Lake Forest-Lake Bluff Historical Society honored entrepreneur Ellen Stirling, whose Lake Forest heritage runs deep.

In 1922, her grandmother, Margaret Baxter Foster, started the Sports Shop in Market Square. Now called the Lake Forest Shop, the business has remained in Ellen's family for almost a century and she is the third generation of women to bring style and business acumen to the community.

Members and guests enjoyed a captivating conversation between Ellen and TV journalist Mary Ann Childers on Sunday, October 23 in the Cressey Auditorium at Lake Forest Academy.

Ellen discussed how her business has evolved to remain competitive and current while sharing personal anecdotes intertwining history and community.

It is getting hard to find a good pair of face gloves with the fingers cut out. Have you seen eye shadow on Roy George of Culture Club and "Karma Chameleon" fans?

Many of the hot artists this year made their break into the charts with groundbreaking videos, such as Duran Duran's Hungry *Like a Wolf* and Michael Jackson's epic 13-minute video "Thriller." Because there is no cable TV in town, residents missed Madonna's "Like a Virgin" opening number of the inaugural MTV music awards hosted by Dede Aykroyd and Bette Midler.

If pop music isn't your thing, Run-D.M.C.'s pioneering debut album is the first rap album to go gold. New strains of underground rock are emerging from the Red Hot Chili

FORMER SOVIET AMBASSADOR SPEAKS ABOUT SOVIET-AMERICAN RELATIONS

In January, Pulitzer Prize-winning historian George F. Kennan spoke at Lake Forest College. A career diplomat and professor emeritus at the Institute for Advanced Study at Princeton, he served as Ambassador to the U.S.S.R. in 1952 and to Yugoslavia in 1961-63. Excerpts from his talk are highlighted here:

- Relations between the United States and the Soviet Union are at the most dangerous level ever partly because the arms race is out of control and partly because of an "almost complete breakdown in the normal communications between nations".
- Washington's anti-communist rhetoric with its emphasis on building up nuclear arms before negotiating any treaty has angered the Soviets. Following the deployment of new U.S. nuclear missiles in Western Europe, the Soviets walked out on strategic arms talks as they felt "put on the spot".
- Relations between the U.S. and European NATO members have been strained due to the deployment of the missiles. There has been opposition by many Europeans in recent years to postpone or cancel deployment.
- Kennan thought Western Europeans would gradually become accustomed

to the missiles. But, he felt that Europeans are finding the dominant role the U.S. plays in NATO increasingly hard to take.

- Kennan argued the U.S. should announce that it will not be the first to use nuclear weapons but should first increase conventional military forces to resist an attack by the Soviet Union.

Ambassador Kennan's nephew, Eugene Hotchkiss, is President of Lake Forest College. The Ambassador's uncle (also named George Kennan) lectured at Lake Forest College in 1891 and 1892 about his travels to Russia.

Ambassador Kennan is considered one of the most influential diplomats of this century.

GROUND BROKEN AT ARMOUR WOODS

Tanglely Oaks Associates has broken ground for Armour Woods, situated on 29 acres of the estate built by Philip D. Armour III and his wife Gwendolyn. The Tudor Revival mansion house, designed by architect Harse T. Lindeberg, was built in 1932 and houses the offices of United Educators, a book publisher.

The development will have 84 attached "Gardenhouses" in the Cape Cod and colonial style with conservation areas surrounding the site. The market is expected to be couples who no longer have children at home. Already on the former estate site are 86 single family homes on half-acre lots.

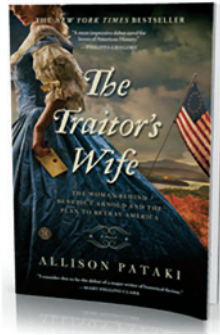

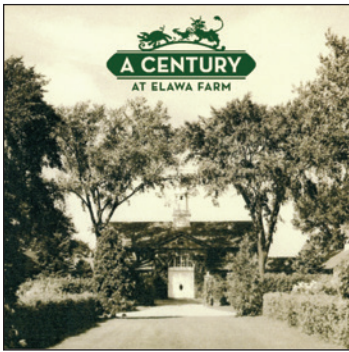
