LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Our year began as a vibrant museum: hosting a sold-out Burns Supper, a packed Trivia Night and our first-ever Valentine's Day cabaret. Then the coronavirus pandemic rocked our world and life as we knew it completely shut down.

By March 17 we were working remotely. In a quick pivot, we brought all our exhibits online and began an initiative to collect photos and stories of how the coronavirus was impacting our community in real-time. This award-winning effort resulted in a digital exhibit called "300 Photos in 30 Days: A Candid Look at Covid-19."

Meanwhile we knew we had to stay relevant so virtual programming ramped up and as Spring emerged so did a new series of walking tours called *History on the Move!*

Grant writing and fundraising were a major focus. With the help of a GoFundMe campaign, virtual Local Legends event and Year End Appeal, plus salary reductions for staff and PPP reimbursement, we were able to cover our operational expenses and end the year with a brief sigh of relief.

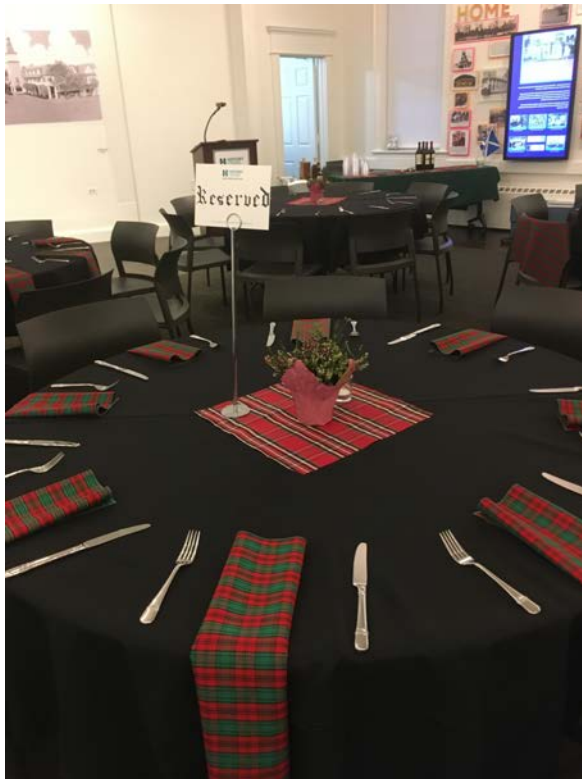

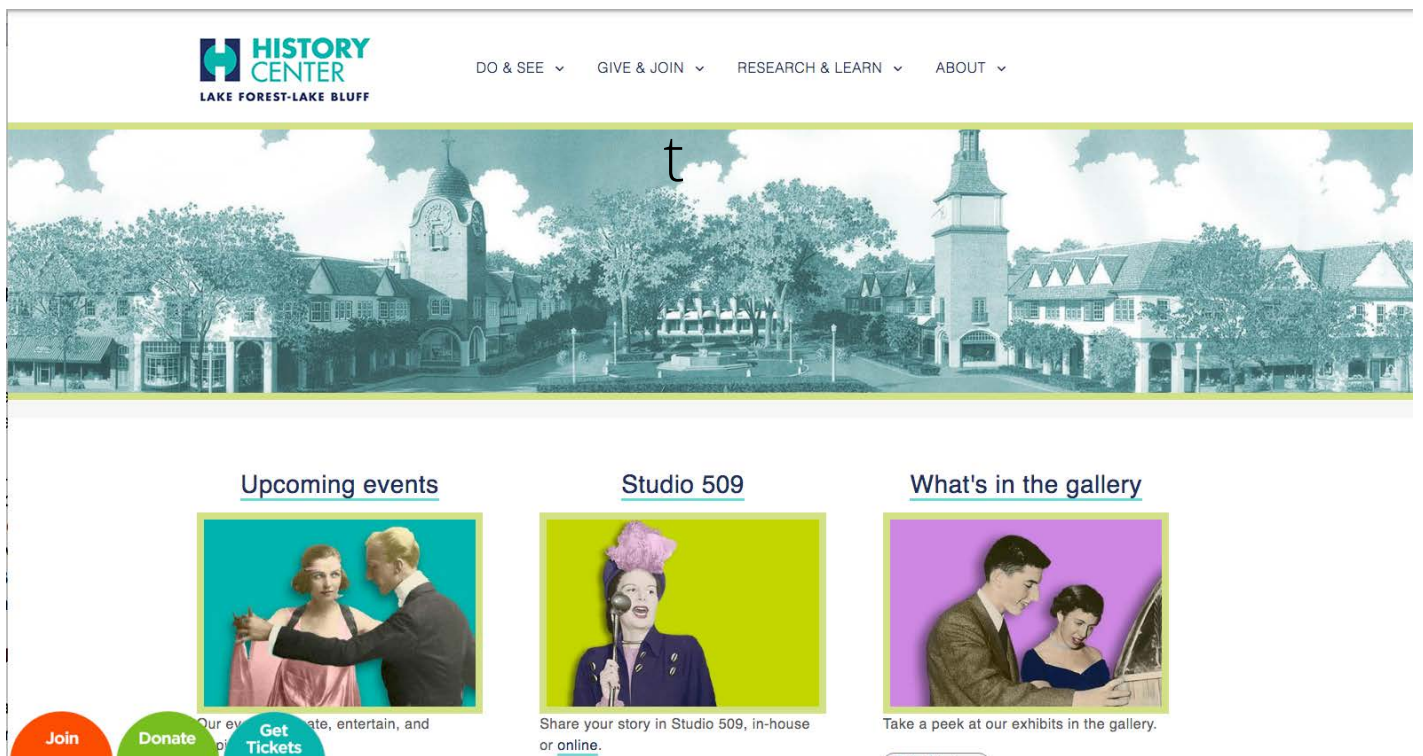

Curated by the History Center, this beautiful show traced the life and work of Lake Forest resident James Leland Lockhart, one of America's foremost nature and wildlife artists.

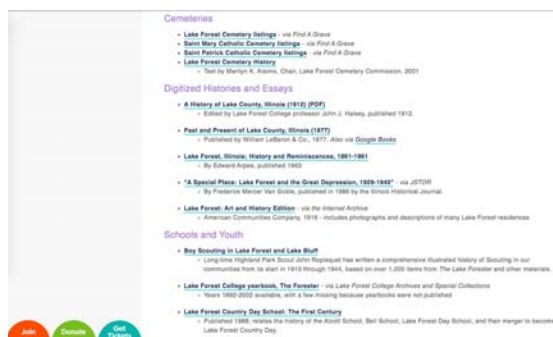
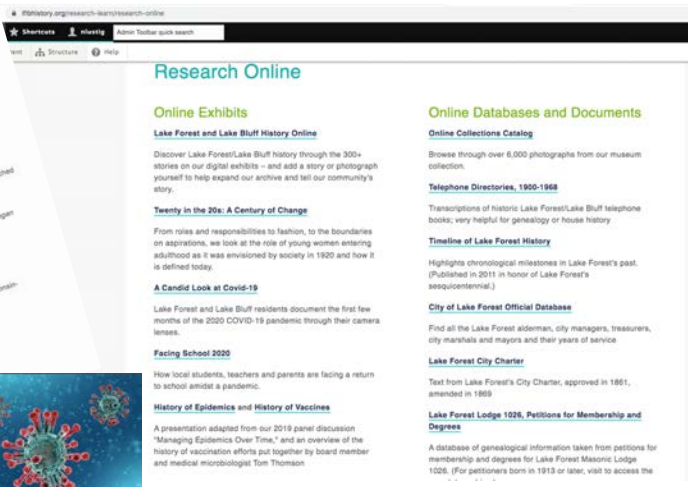

Overall, the election was a landslide victory for the Republican party, both locally and nationally, as Warren G. Harding became the first sitting U.S. Senator to be elected president.

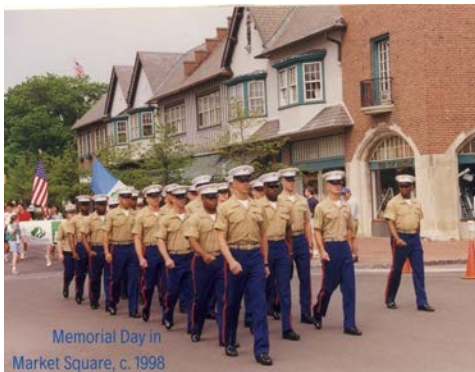

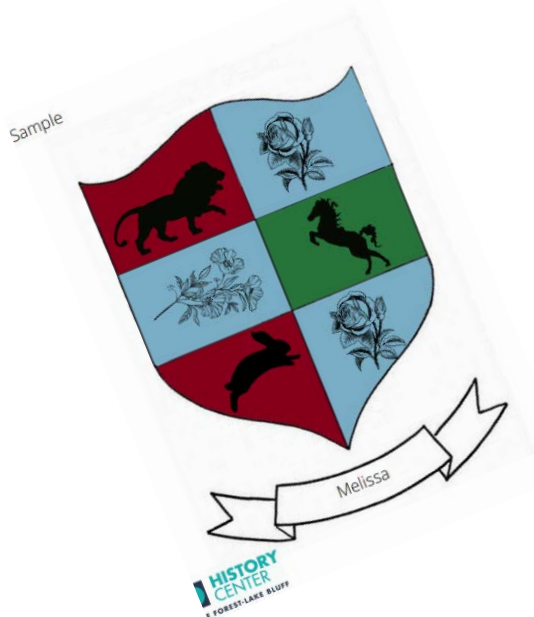

SUMMER REOPENING!

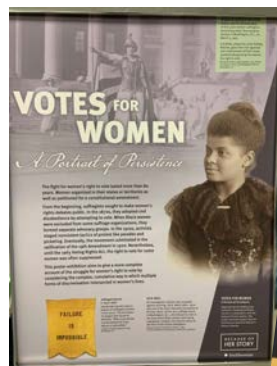
With Covid safety measures in place (including individual styluses for use on the touchscreens and ample supplies of face masks, hand sanitizer and cleaning fluid) we reopened the museum to the public with reduced days and hours and limited group sizes of 10 and under.

New Shelving

New Scanner

As we grow our collection of archival materials, a new scanner was critical. With a gift from Maddie Dugan and The Hunter Family, we now have a scanner and computer to store thousands of new images for the digital archive. This will serve the community well as we prepare for our next major exhibit on some of the most significant maps in our collections.

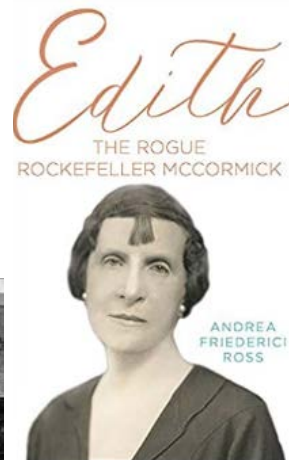
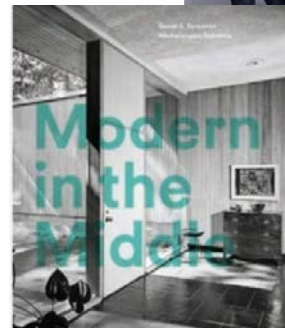

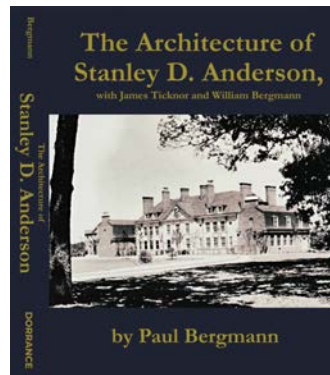

During the shutdowns we planned several events to keep our membership connected including virtual happy half hours and a holiday party Trivia Night.

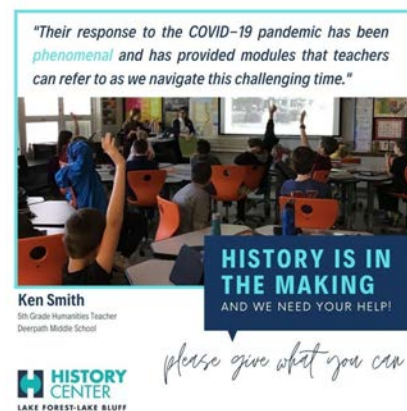


E-FUNDRAISING

Go Fund Me Campaign Raised \$47,355



With the help of a video testimonial from Larry Potash (WGN Morning News Anchor) and an aggressive, testimonial-driven, social media campaign, "History in the Making," the History Center raised almost \$50K in its first-ever GoFundMe effort. These funds helped cover the mounting deficit caused by the loss of program, rental and sponsorship income.



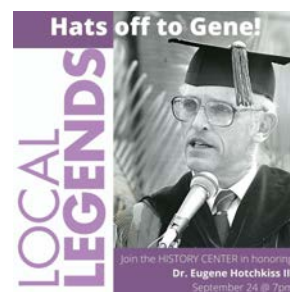
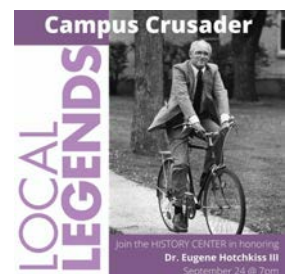
FUNDRAISING

Virtual Local Legends Signature Event Raised \$51,362

Local Legends honoring Dr. Eugene Hotchkiss III raised over \$50K with a virtual interview/event. This was the largest Local Legends audience in our history, with more than 150 viewers at the evening's event, and an additional 150 or more in the days that followed.

Guests were invited to "Tie one on with Gene" (who is known for his bow ties) by ordering a special cocktail mix and dinner to enjoy during the event.

Guests also had the opportunity to send Gene a video message to play that evening, or submit a personal note for inclusion in a keepsake book, in lieu of being able to congratulate our Local Legend in person.

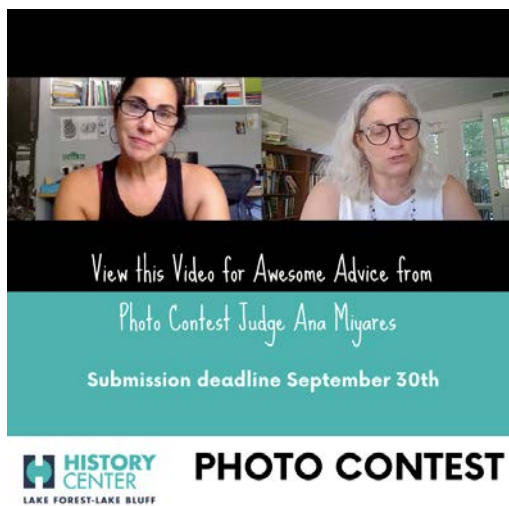
